In accordance with Section VI, *Remedial Measures*, Item B, *CMOM Programs*, paragraph 28.o, *Sewer Overflow Response Plan*, of the referenced Consent Decree, attached is the Sewer Overflow Response Plan (SORP) establishing the timely and effective methods and means of responding to, cleaning up, and/or minimizing the impact of all sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs); reporting the location, volume, cause, and impact of all SSOs to the Cabinet and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA); and notifying the potentially impacted public. On the anniversary date of EPA approval of the SORP, the city of Winchester (City) and the Winchester Municipal Utilities (WMU) will annually review and recommend changes as appropriate.
